Come one, come all - to the 10th Annual Oakland County AFG Fall Workshop! The **New Beginnings** Group is excited to host the Workshop this year and promises to deliver an inspiring, informative, joyful and entertaining experience. The Workshop will take place Saturday, September 21st from 9 AM until 2 PM at the **First Presbyterian Church of Birmingham**, 1669 West Maple Road, Birmingham.

The Fall Workshop is both a learning opportunity for the fellowship and the annual fundraiser to help support the Oakland County AFG office, including the Alateen and Public Outreach programs. Our 7th Tradition states "Every group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions". Since we are self-supporting, the funds we raise from the Workshop help to reach out to those that need help, which is after all, our primary purpose. The Oakland County Office serves as an Al-Anon Information Service and Literature Distribution Center and is an important and invaluable resource to our community. All contributions and funds are used to meet expenses for rent, utilities, insurance, office operations, meeting lists, literature, website, our District Reps and Liaison, and contributions to MIAFG and the WSO.

The projected goals for this year's Workshop are to increase attendance to 125 participants and to raise \$2000 through ticket sales and the Silent Auction. The Committee is well organized and has Chairpersons and Co-Chairpersons for each subcommittee. The theme of the Workshop is **The Many Gifts of Al-Anon** and we are planning an interactive, participatory and fun-filled day. The morning program will include a continental breakfast, a speaker's panel, entertainment and creating a craft project. This will be followed by lunch, announcement of the Silent Auction winners and an afternoon "Speed Sharing" segment.

Taking Al-Anon With Me Wherever I Go

A few years ago, I went to another state to take part in a family program for a relative who was in a drug rehab facility . They suggested attending Al-Anon meetings while we were there. I met other people's family members, and we attended the meetings together. Familiar faces accompanied me to those meetings in an unfamiliar environment. Even though I was out of town, I felt at ease attending with others whom I had befriended. I had not gone by myself.

When I got home, I found some meetings which worked for me time-wise. The first time I went by myself, I got to the church, sat in the parking lot, and drove back home. I tried again the next day, and somehow found the courage to walk in. I then began working my Al-Anon program of recovery. I got a Sponsor, attended several meetings a week, read the literature and began working on the 12 Steps.

I took a week-long vacation in the beginning phase of my recovery. I brought along my Courage to Change book and it stayed in my suitcase the entire time and did not attend any meetings while I was away. Quite frankly, the thought never crossed my mind. Speaking of my mind, boy, did that quickly digress into a very dangerous neighborhood during those seven days. I didn't even realize my "stinkin' thinkin'" until I was in the plane on my way home, obsessing about other people. I couldn't wait to get back to go to my regular meetings, and my Al-Anon family. At that point, I decided that whenever I travel from then on, I would attend Al-Anon meetings.

The next vacation was a few months later, and before I went I pointed my browser to the Al-Anon WSO website (www.al-anon.alateen.org). I found meeting lists there for every single state, and many cities within each state. From there I clicked on the local Al-Anon websites to get more detailed information about the meetings. I printed it and off I went, with many options for meetings to attend. I had my plan to attend a certain meeting at noon. Similarly to my very first Al-Anon meeting ever, I totally bailed out. I was so uncomfortable thinking about walking into a room of complete strangers. After feeling bad for most of that day, I looked at my handy list, and made the decision to go to another meeting that evening. I drove there, parked my car, and rallied up the courage to walk in the door. Upon entering the room, I saw conference approved literature on a table, chairs set up in a circle, some with bodies in them. Someone immediately greeted me, and asked if I needed a newcomer packet. Everything seemed so comfortable and familiar to me, like I had just entered the home of a favorite relative. When the leader opened the meeting, she read the exact same suggested opening that I hear at my local meetings. There were some brief announcements about local events, and a reading from one of the Al-Anon conference approved books. As I listened to people share, I could not help but to think that I knew these people. The stories are all so similar, even if the faces are different. I felt like I belonged there, and was never again afraid to go to an unfamiliar meeting.

I have been given the opportunity to travel to different states, and to locate and attend many different meetings. On one of my excursions, I travelled with my ex to visit our son. My Higher Power provided me a great occasion to work my program, big time. On that occasion, we had to drive together in a car for over two hours. He became agitated over the difference in our attitudes, and tried to engage me into an argument. I was able to detach, get out my journal which I carry with me always, and to simply write down my thoughts and feeling rather than have the verbal lashing of the past. No reactions. As soon as we arrived at our destination, I went to an Al-Anon meeting. I confidently walked through the door, knowing that I belong there, and that there was help. I was right.

Now, whenever I travel, I look forward to attending the local Al-Anon meetings. I find a unity there unlike any other. I may arrive a stranger, but have met some wonderful people on the road, that I would not have had the opportunity to otherwise. And I depart a friend. I always meet regular folks, just like me, who speak a common language, are are in various degrees of the recovery process. Some have many more years of beautiful wisdom, and there are the newcomers as well. The one thing for certain is, I fit in there somewhere, and always walk out of a meeting with new information I didn't have walking in the door. And I know it is good.

I encourage anyone to follow my lead. Even if you travel with others, I highly recommend giving yourself the gift of your Serenity by taking an hour to yourself and discovering the local flavor of Al-Anon. I did, and I am grateful for it.

Local Sponsors Answer Some Common Questions About Alateen

What makes an Al-Anon Group want to start an Alateen meeting?

Inviting an Alateen to speak inspires groups! "I think the Al-Anons (and Alcoholics) realize through Alateen speakers, literature and meetings just how this insidious disease affects not only them but also their children." Ron V.

"A concern for teens and the realization that there is a need for Alateen are a couple of things that motivate an Al-Anon group to begin an Alateen meeting." Bill C.

What made you want to be an Alateen sponsor?

"I think it was more because I was a child of two Alcoholics, and felt I could relate to the kids. Also, I was looking to do service work." Michele K-H

What's involved in getting an Alateen meeting started?

"A little paper work and a BIG heart." Ron V.

"Our group had a group conscience after a few members mentioned that they were parents of teenagers, and one of our members decided to become an Alateen Sponsor. We filled out some paperwork, passed out flyers at Al-Anon and AA meetings in the area, and the rest is history! After just one year, we have 4 kids going to KOMIAC." Therese S.

"Sponsors are needed, preferably two. The group also needs to be sure there is room for the teens at the meeting place, separate from the Al-Anon meeting. There are forms to fill out, and then it's time to get the word out about the new meeting." Bill C.

What's the difference between an Alateen meeting and an Al-Anon meeting?

"The only difference between an Al-Anon meeting and an Alateen meeting is the age of the participants." Ron V.

"I don't think they are different at all. Same steps, same issues." Michele K-H

"Alateen is part of Al-Anon, so it uses the same 12 steps. Alateen has its own literature that is specifically geared toward younger people." Bill C.

What are the greatest rewards of sponsoring an Alateen meeting?

"There are too many rewards to mention. For me, though, it is when the teens realize alcoholism is a disease, and they can still love the alcoholic while hating his/her disease. Also, when I see them realize what effect it had on them, they learn they can address their issues in a healthy way and have a good chance at a happy life." Ron V.

At just about every Alateen meeting I attend, I get to work on the stuff I didn't get to work on when I was a teenager living in a home impacted by alcoholism. What a privilege to be able to 'grow up' right along with the kids I sponsor!" Therese S.

"That's hard to put into words... there are many rewards, but they are hard to quantify and describe. There is an incredible feeling that overwhelms me when the teens share with each other and encourage each other." Bill C.

"My greatest Alateen reward is tied in with my greatest angst. The reward is watching these kids 'get' the steps or use each other to figure out the answer. They know what the problem is, but when they become part of the solution it is awesome. The hardest thing for me is letting them figure it out, and not helping them. That is where my God box helps. I visualize my paper being the person, and I am putting them in God's hands. I love going to an Alateen meeting because they are so honest...and that makes me more honest and open. They have the best view of how Al-Anon works, "It works if you work it, and it sucks if you don't!" How simple is that? So my greatest reward is the watching these kid's grow and watch myself grow along with them. But the 2nd greatest reward is they allow me to be their sponsor." Alisa B.
