We've turned the page, gotten a new calendar, made a resolution for change in the new year! So, let's start by reviewing Step One. We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable.

Some folks who have been in Al-Anon for a bit and have grown in the program, like to expand our powerlessness to "people, places and things." The goal now is to focus on changing the unmanageability of our lives

from the inside, not trying to alter the world. Before we tried to control more, got angry, anxious, losing our own voice and serenity.

Think of how you bake a cake. You make a shopping list and go to the store, find the ingredients - do they fit your grocery budget? - and set aside a time to bake. You collect and mix all the ingredients - by hand or with mixer? - pour the batter into the prepared pan, put it into the oven, and then let it bake. You have set the timer according to the recipe directions. You probably also know if your oven bakes high, low, whatever.

You don't climb into the oven to make sure it does its job. You may want to turn the oven light on so you can see what's happening. If you stand there and watch... well, what might be better use of your time? You have to trust that the cake will turn out. Even if the oven temperature is slightly off, and the cake is overdone, is it still okay? There is nothing

you could have done to avoid the peculiarities of the oven, or the ingredients, the cake will come out as it is supposed to this time. Maybe it's a little burned, or doesn't look like the picture in the reci-

pe. Is it still good? Did you learn something for next time?

All the cook can do is show up, take the best action, and let go of the results. Let the universe do its job. Standing back, you may see how well everything gets arranged. Also, don't forget to smile. You are allowed to enjoy the process. Slow down, breathe, take you plans about fixing the

world to a meeting or to your sponsor. You'll find a loving, non-judgmental place to share your

thoughts and feelings. One cake at a time.

"I pray to be released from my compulsion to control my situation. I have so often proved I am unable to control it, Let me think, know and feel

my powerlessness, then I will at least learn to let go and let God" - One Day at a Time in Al-Anon, p.30. Anticipating Steps Two and Three, right?

The bookmark <u>Just for Today</u> says: "Just for today I will adjust myself to what is, and not try to adjust everything to my own desires. I will take my luck as it comes, and fit myself to it."

BUILDING A BARN THE OLD-FASHIONED WAY

Ever think about how farmers in American history,

built a barn? It's a community project, folks coming together with all types of talents and tools. Barn raising, or "raising bee," was an important piece of



rural life in the 18th century. Building a barn was a community event, involving women and children in addition to men. While the men completed the work necessary to assemble the barn's framework, women were working diligently to prepare food for the workers. It was considered a privilege to participate.

So what does this have to do with Al-Anon? How about as it relates to: Step 12: "Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to others, and to practice these principles in all our affairs." A key word here is "we." Even as the barn builders brought a bunch of folks together, each knowing what he or she could do, Al-Anon members can
